Health Policy, Medication and Safety Plans



Parents/guardians must submit the following forms before Winter/Spring on the Farm begins:

- Emergency contact and health information
- Written permission to administer any medications (including dosage and schedule) if your child requires a medication during their time at CHP

All forms must be completed, signed and received for a child to attend on their first day of Winter or Spring on the Farm.

Health Policy

We have worked hard to develop a health plan to cover all the bases in caring for your child while they are with us. *Any parent/guardian may request to see the Health Care Policy in full at any time.*

Our Health Policy states that:

- ◆ Health histories and immunization records are collected for all staff and students .
- ◆ Allergies are reviewed and planned for each session.
- ◆ Staff are informed of all pre-existing health conditions.
- ◆ First Aid kits are kept fully stocked.
- ◆ Emergency contact info is kept on hand at all times.

Medications

All medication will be securely stored. Our Health Policy states that ALL medication:

- ◆ Will be stored properly
- ◆ Will only be administered when authorized in writing by a parent/guardian
- ◆ Will be administered by the Health Supervisor

Parents/guardians will be notified immediately if a dose is missed or refused.

Safety Plan

Our Safety Plan states that:

- All Staff and Volunteers must pass CORI and SORI checks
- All Staff carry walkie talkies and a phone at all times for communication
- All Staff and Volunteers are Child Safety Trained

Disaster Plan

In the event that Wheeler Road CHP premises must be evacuated but weather permits, Staff will guide students to White's Fields of Community Harvest Project at 40 North Brigham Hill Road. Parents/guardians will be immediately notified, and should pick their children up from this location as communicated.

In the case of a significant disaster — like a natural disaster — such that we must vacate the premises, all students will be bussed to Grafton Senior Center at 30 Providence Road, Grafton, MA. Parents/guardians will be immediately notified, and should pick their children up from this location as communicated.

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First Aid

For minor injuries, like scrapes, slight bruises or non-allergic reactions to bug bites First Aid will be administered on site by certified staff. Parents/guardians will be notified of these injuries at pick-up.

For injuries requiring more serious medical attention, an ambulance will take students to UMASS Memorial Hospital. Parents/guardians will be notified immediately. Any such accidents will be reported to MA DPH.
